The Dawn of Astrology with Dr Nick Campion

Sunday 23 November 2008

Western astrology as we know it, based on the casting of horoscopes, seems to have emerged sometime between 500 and 200 BCE. But its origins probably date back to the dawn of human consciousness, when humans first made the connection between the sun and light, or between the moon and the tides.

This workshop, based on the latest scholarship and on material in Nick's book, *The Dawn of Astrology*, will examine previously hard-to-find evidence concerning the use of the sky as a source of meaning of wisdom on the old stone-age, examine the development of thinking on megalithic astronomy and look at the contributions of Egypt and Babylon to the origins of western astrology.

- **The Speaking Sky:** evidence for the use of the sky as a source of wisdom in the old stone-age
- **Stones and Stars:** putting megalithic culture in context; what is the latest evidence concerning the extent and function of astronomically-aligned stone monuments?
- **Planets and Pyramids:** what exactly was Egyptian astrology, and what is the evidence for its evolution from the Old Kingdom pyramid builders to the Ptolemies?
- **Omens and Auguries:** a fresh look at the earliest Babylonian astrology, and the evidence for its practices and development.



Nick Campion is the head of the Sophia Centre for the Study of Cosmology in Culture at the University of Wales, Lampeter and course director of the MA in Cultural Astronomy and Astrology. He is the author *The Dawn of Astrology: A Cultural History of Western Astrology, Vol. 1 (The Ancient and Classical Worlds)*, London: Continuum, 2008.
